1 SUBJECT

This document is intended to provide assistance with the musical part during WRRC competitions.

2 MUSIC DEFINITION

2.1 Time signature and tempo

 $4/4 = 1 \, \text{Bar}$

Expressed in Bar Per Minute: BPM (uppercase).


The music used in a RR competition is divided into 4 (four) beats (takts) in one bar – ie. 4/4.

bpm (lowercase) = beats per minute

48 BPM = 192 bpm

2.2 Rock'n'Roll/Rock music rhythm

The drum set consists of at least a bass drum, a snare drum or claps and cymbals. Also, use of electric distorted guitar is preferred.




Definition of 4/4 rock rhythm

- the first beat of each odd bars is the biggest accent,
- the next big accent is the first beat of all even beat.
- the 3rd beat of all bars is the secondary accent,
- and the 2-4-6-8. beats is unstressed.

2.3 Additional drum set

In case of superposition of Rock'n'Roll drums on music of a different musical style, please take care that the added drums are perfectly synchronized with the original music drums.

2.4 Music Intro and Outro

An **INTRO** is the opening section of a piece of music, usually before the singing begins. An **OUTRO** is the section that ends a music. Therefore, an outro can be considered the opposite of an intro. The OUTRO can be a closing beat, or it can be longer, which can deviate from the original tempo. However, deviated tempo part is not included in the so-called RR part. (See 2.4).

2.5 The Rock'n'Roll Part (RR Part)


The Rock'n'Roll part (RR part) is the part of the music where the Rock'n'Roll rhythm style is played and where can clearly heard the tempo and the accents.

2.6 Definition of the Bridge and Intermezzo

Bridge: Out of melody or not out of melody and unchanged tempo.

Intermezzo: Out of melody and changed tempo.

Bridge: a musical transition between 2 types of music. A bridge can also be a short transition between two different RR-form themes. Its main characteristic is that the tempo does not change during the transition. So, the Bridge can be out of melody but at the same time with an unchanging tempo.



Intermezzo can be not only out of melody, but also with a change of tempo and style.

3 TEMPO AND QUALITY

Tempo Correction

It is preferred that the tempo correction must be a maximum of 30% faster/slower than the original song.
